For those unfamiliar with the series (or the television show based on the books), Brennan is a forensic anthropologist. This story begins with a female web sleuth who tries to solve cold cases. She brings Brennan a recording of a girl supposedly being tortured and gives her the area in the North Carolina mountains where the tape was found. Is everything as it seems or is there something more to the story? Brennan's search begins; more bones are found, and with the assistance of a local sheriff, she is able to uncover the truth.
